This act of violent misogyny was felt by many Canadians and led Parliament to designate December 6 as The National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women. Today is not simply about remembering the 14 who were killed in the Montreal Massacre, but it is about remembering others who have been harmed by genderbased violence. For those students who attended the Moose Hide Campaign last year, wearing your Moose Hide pin also shows that you will stand for a school and community free from genderbased violence.
