

ORANGE SHIRT DAY

Orange Shirt Day grew out of a Residential School survivor's account of losing a grandmothergifted orange shirt on her first day of school at the St. Joseph Mission in Williams Lake, BC. Each year, on September 30th, Canadians wear orange to honor the memories of children who died, and the survivors who continue to share their stories.

At the start of the year, the students from room 32 noticed that the orange ribbon memorial on our school's chain-link fence had faded. We learned that 6,000 children died at Canadian Residential School. We wanted to make a difference, and help preserve their memories by adding 6,000 more orange ribbons. We counted, organized, and delivered ribbons to the Leila North homerooms. Everyone in the school worked together to tie them to the fence at the west-end of our parking lot. On September 30th, our class spent a few humbling minutes observing and sharing our thoughts about the completed fence ribbons. The orange-covered fence reminds us of why every child matters, and why wearing orange is important each year on September 30th. Our school community worked together to help us achieve the goal of displaying these 6,000 orange ribbons.








Poems and Six Word Memoirs


