School Bus Cancellation Policy

Metro Winnipeg School Superintendents have made a change in the policy for cancellation of school bus service due to cold weather.

The new policy will use the temperature reading at The Forks instead of the Airport.

School busses will be cancelled if the wind-chill reading is -45 or colder at 6:00 a.m. at The Forks according to Environment Canada.

Notice of school bus cancellations will be provided to media outlets and posted on school division websites as soon as the 6:00 a.m. reading is posted by Environment Canada.

The change was made as weather conditions at The Forks are closer to weather conditions in most residential areas where children are waiting for school buses. This should result in fewer cancellations.



Caden's Story

Caden is my little brother. He is super talkative to the point where once in a while we could all use some peace and quiet. Caden also has Profound Hearing Loss which means that without support of cochlear implant, which we call his ears, he cannot hear a thing.

Caden was born in September of 2008. My first memory was holding him and I remember crying because I was so happy to have a brother who I could talk to and who could hear me. It took about a week until Mom realized something was wrong. Whenever she spoke to him, he had no reaction. The only time he reacted what through vibrations.



Mom fought for Caden but it was difficult to find the proper specialist. Finally, when Caden was 9 months old, Dr. Barker listened to my mom and the real battle for this little boy started. Caden went through a series of tests that included an ET, and ABR, booth hearing tests, MRI's and CT scans, all to determine Caden had Profound Hearing Loss. This means that due to the fact that part of his hearing system didn't fully develop, Caden couldn't hear a single thing.



Fast forward a little and Dr. Leitao who is Caden's ENT, or hearing specialist, determined that Caden would be a good candidate for cochlear implants. Most people know what hearing aid is for. Hearing aids amplify sounds so they may be detected by damaged ears. With cochlear implants, a receiver is placed under the skin of the skull, behind the ears. This is the internal part of the device and it allows the external part to connect. The receiver collects the signals from the external device which look sort of like hearing aid that is worn behind the ear. This is complicated to understand and explain but basically, the external part sends the sounds through the receiver and it stimulates the auditory nerve to the brain allows people who have it, to hear.

In March of 2010, Mom, our babysitter and Caden flew to Toronto where a specialist would perform and 4 hour surgery. Dad and I stayed behind and nervously waited for them to come home. That week felt like forever!

Mom had the opportunity to experience Caden hearing for the first time while in Toronto but it was a new experience for me and my dad. When Caden came home, I was so happy to see him and excited for him to hear my voice. When the implant was turned on, Caden began to cry because all of the sound was so new and scary for him but he over time he was able to become used to them. Because Caden couldn't hear for the first two years of his life, learning to talk took a little bit longer. He has learned ASL and now at 9 years old he can talk. He still has some trouble with some words or names but he is getting there.

I wanted to share Caden's story with you because he is an inspiration to me and as his big brother, who he looks up to, I wanted to make sure more people know about what hearing loss and cochlear implants look like. Because the cost implants is so high, and can range from \$25 000 to \$100 000, our family has had to do some major fundraising to help with the cost of up-keep for the devices as well as travel and loss of work time when Caden needs check-ups and appointments. We are trying to plan a Bud, Spud and Steak fundraise for the future and I can let everyone know when we have a date. In the mean time, if you would like to help in anyway, you go to Go Fund Me and search Caden's Story. The medical cost are high but the batteries range from \$200 to \$300 for one pack.

It has been quite the fight but Caden has really come out on top. He might have Profound Hearing Loss but there is no stopping him.

Thank you for letting me share Caden's story with you.
