

Then on May 5 - 8 a group of students will be heading up north to Duck Bay for a four day Fiddle Jamboree with 500 other students from all over Northern Manitoba. This is more of a solo/small group opportunity for fiddlers to play by themselves. The performance starts at 7:00 p.m.


